Every child has a chosen friend in their new class and the teachers are really pleased with the dynamics of the new classes.

The Year 2 Sports Day sadly had to be postponed this week due to some rainfall over lunchtime which had made the ground slippery. These decisions are never easy and we recognise they are not popular with parents who have taken time off work either so we do apologise for any inconvenience caused through the circumstance which was fully out of our control.
