### Message from Wiltshire Council:

Although we are always keen to encourage pupils, families and staff to choose active and sustainable modes to travel to school, we'd like to remind everyone that electric scooters are not currently legal for use on the roads, cycle paths or pavements in the UK. Current legislation considers electric scooters to be motor vehicles and subject to the same requirements for licensing and insurance as motorbikes and cars and currently only permits their use on private land with the permission of the landowner. The same legislation also applies to other 'powered transporters' including Segways, hoverboards, go-peds (combustion engine-powered kick-scooters), powered unicycles, and u-wheels.
