Relationships and Behaviour

One of the priorities on our School Improvement Action Plan this academic year is Relationships and Behaviour. Drawing on the work by inspirational behaviour management author Paul Dix and from his book 'When the Adults Change, Everything Changes' we have decided to adopt his suggested behaviour strategy to create the 3 simple expectations for our school community;

Be ready

Be respectful

Be safe

These 3 expectations are part of a whole-school approach to promoting positive relationships and learning behaviours. This week, the children have used these 3 simple statements to create their class charters and consider how they create a happy school where they can Enjoy, Explore and Learn. Not only are these 3 expectations key for the children in our school, they are the expectation for every member of staff, every parent and anyone else who comes into contact with us through the wider community too.

We are even more thrilled to learn that our Junior School friends are adopting the same expectations which really does mean familiarity, fidelity and consistency across the whole site.

One of the first things we are doing as a result of these expectations is updating and creating some changes to our Relationships and Behaviour Policy. We will send a copy of this out to you in due course.

School costs for the year

As ever, we always try to keep costs to an absolute minimum but it is hoped this will be a big help to parents to support and not put too much pressure on finances.

Pupil Premium

Have your financial circumstances changed? Do you think you might be eligible for further financial support? If your family claims certain benefits, your child may be eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant. This can often be confusing as it is also known as 'Free School Meals' but of course, every child at Harnham Infant School is entitled to Free School Meals. However, if you qualify for the Pupil Premium Grant, school will also be able to support you with other costs such as paying for school uniform, paying for school trips and for your child to attend an extra-curricular club too. 
